## Dear Valued Customer,

In order to provide an extended migration period for our customers, Spansion plans to issue an advance change notification (ACN) in late 2012 that will End-of-Life (EOL) the 90nm MirrorBit GL-P product offerings. The obsolescence notice will provide the customary 6-month Last-Time-Buy (LTB) plus 6-month Last-Time-Ship (LTS) schedules to our customers.

Spansion introduced the GL-S 65nm MirrorBit™ Eclipse Flash Family in 2Q of 2011. All densities, 1 Gbit, 512Mbit, 256Mbit, and 128Mbit, are now in high-volume production.

The S29GL-S product family supercedes the S29GL-P product family. Customers should consult the respective datasheets for technical guidance at:
