



Description:

Panel rivet tool is ideal for quick and easy installation of drive rivets. The one piece drive rivets provide a fast, economic means of affixing wiring duct. The rivet is inserted into a 3/16" pre-punched hole and the pin is driven into the base using the panel rivet tool, thereby expanding the rivet legs and locking the duct and sub-panel in place. The panel thickness (including the duct thickness) should be a maximum of 3/16".

Features:

- Metal core guarantees stability and long durability.
- Long shaft aids in insertion of rivets into deep channels or at locations difficult to access.
- Ergonomic design of the tool ensures effortless use.
- Colour is yellow (YE)
