# DF2S5M4FS

#### General

The DF2S5M4FS is a TVS diode (ESD protection diode) protects semiconductor devices used in automotive interfaces and other applications to protect against static electricity and noise.

Utilizing snapback characteristics, the DF2S5M4FS provides low dynamic resistance and superior protective performance.

Furthermore, it is optimum for the high speed signal line because of the low capacitance performance. The DF2S5M4FS is housed in an ultra-compact package (1.0 mm  $\times$  0.6 mm) to meet applications that require a small footprint.



#### 3. Features

- (1) AEC-Q101 qualified (Note 1)
- (2) Suitable for use with a 3.3 V signal line.  $(V_{RWM} \le 3.6 \text{ V})$
- (3) Protects devices with its high ESD performance. ( $V_{ESD} > \pm 30 \text{ kV}$  (Contact / Air) @ISO10605)
- (4) Low dynamic resistance protects semiconductor devices from static electricity and noise.  $(R_{DYN} = 0.35 \Omega \text{ (typ.)})$
- (5) Snapback characteristics realizing low clamping voltage protects semiconductor devices.  $(V_C = 8.3 \text{ V@I}_{PP} = 2 \text{ A (typ.)})$








Fig. 6.1.2 -8 kV





Fig. 6.1.3 IEC61000-4-2 (Contact)




Fig. 6.3.1 V<sub>C</sub> - I<sub>PP</sub>




Fig. 6.3.2 Based on IEC61000-4-5 8/20  $\mu$ s pulse. ED.3




Fig. 8.1 Definitions of Electrical Characteristics




Fig. 9.1 I-V




Fig. 9.2 I<sub>R</sub> - V<sub>R</sub>




Fig. 9.3 Ct - VR




Fig. 9.4 Ct - f






Fig. 9.5 S21 - f








