



1. History

A small piece of history is included on the top of each Airfix kit box. This gives some background information of the product, including actions the real item was involved in. The area also shows the dimensions of the finished model and the number of pieces.

2. Flying hours

Become a member of the Airfix Club and you can collect the Flying Hours to receive FREE model kits. The bigger the kit, the more Flying Hours are available to accumulate.

3. Skill level

The skill level, from 1 to 4, explains how difficult the model will be. A higher skill level kit often has more parts and is more challenging to build.

4. Paint list

The paint list shows and explains the recommended list of Humbrol[™] paints that will enable you to create the best finish for your model. (Please note, this area is on Classic kits only. A full list of Humbrol[™] paints required are in the kit instructions for larger Gift Sets).

5. Schemes

The scheme options are outlined on the top of the box to show how many choices of kit are available, with their markings and descriptions.

6. Decals

The side profiles on the front show how many decal options are possible and what they will look like.

7. Product code

The product code is unique to each kit. It helps you to identify your kit of choice easily, assists with navigating through the catalogue or Airfix website accurately, determines the size of the kit and gives guidance to the number of parts. The Classic Kit product code also helps you to understand the size of the model via the Series system. The kit Series starts at 1 through to 25 (the higher the number, the larger the kit). The first two digits after the "A" determine the Series of the kit. The example product code here, A05134 is Series 5.

8. Model scales

The scale of the kit indicates how large the model will be in relation to the full size. A 1:72 scale kit therefore is 72x smaller than the original (1:48 = 48x smaller). The smaller the scale number – eg 1:24 = the larger the kit compared to the original.

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Pearl Harbor - 75th Anniversary Gift Set

MILITARY AIRCRAFT

Although the history of aviation is much more than war machines, the development of aviation was unquestionably stimulated by conflict. Easy to fly and extremely stable in the air, the aircraft allowed Allied military planners to obtain clear and detailed photographs of enemy positions and troop concentrations.

Significant in the history of aerial warfare, the Fokker Eindecker was the first purpose built German WWI fighter aircraft and the first to be fitted with gun synchronisation gear, which allowed the pilot to shoot through the arc of the propeller and in his line of sight. Once introduced, it took a withering toll of Allied aircraft.

Championed by Hermann Goering, the Messerschmitt Bf 110 Destroyer, (or Heavy Fighter) concept was certainly sound in theory, giving these slightly larger certainty souria in theory, giving these slightly larger aircraft much greater range and devastating firepower. Unfortunately, the increase in size and weight left the Destroyers vulnerable to the more manoeuvrable single engined fighters of the RAF.

The rugged and effective Junkers Ju87B Stuka was designed specifically to be a highly effective airborne artillery piece, capable of supporting fast moving ground units by destroying strategic targets that stood in their way. The Junkers JU87 or Stuka, was a two-man ground attack aircraft and dive bomber which first took to the skies in 1935. The Stuka is famous for delivering the single most deadly assault on British territory in history on the afternoon of 4th July 1940 when thirty three of them sank the 5,500 ton anti-aircraft ship HMS Foylebank in Portland Harbour.

Had the Luftwaffe been able to deploy large numbers of these impressive fighters, they would have taken a heavy toll of Allied aircraft.

The superb handling and low speed of the Fleet Air Arm's Swordfish reconnaissance and torpedo strike aircraft made it ideally suited to the relatively short decks of Britain's WWII aircraft carriers. A single engine monoplane, it was defended by just one A single engine monoplane, it was detended by just one rearward firing machine gun, operated by the radio operator, and its relatively low speed left it vulnerable to enemy aircraft. However it proved to be a devastatingly effective machine in skies not defended by enemy fighters, performing well at Pearl Harbor and going on to have success at the Battle of the Coral Sea and Midway.

The Bristol Blenheim light bomber was one of the most important aircraft available to the RAF at the start of WWII and more Squadrons than any other aircraft. 



Without doubt, the Phantoms of the Fleet Air Arm were some of the most iconic aircraft of the Cold War era.

As one of the most successful jet aircraft of all time, the American built McDonnell Douglas F-4 Phantom was to see service with a number of overseas air arms, with Britain being a significant operator. Originally purchased by the Royal Navy as a modern replacement for their
De Havilland Sea Vixens, Fleet Air Arm Phantoms would
have the primary role of defending the fleet at all times
and in all weather, with a secondary role of strike attack. Designated Phantom FG.1, these Navy jets certainly made for an impressive sight and were some of the most attractive aircraft ever to serve with Britain's armed forces. Operating this huge aircraft from the relatively diminutive deck of HMS Ark Royal required a number of significant modifications to British Phantoms, as well as to the ship itself – they would also require the cream of Britain's fast jet pilots to operate these mighty fighters successfully.























The job of these nocturnal Boeings was to mingle with the bomber stream and using an electronic warfare system known as 'Airborne Cigar' (ABC) attempt to jam German ground controller broadcasts so that the Luftwaffe night fighters could not find and intercept the bombers.



Following the withdrawal of HMS Ark Royal and her compliment of Gannet AEW aircraft, the Gannet's radar units were simply removed and attached under the forward fuselage of the new AEW version of the Shackleton.

With its four Rolls-Royce Griffon engines giving it the nickname Growler, the Shackleton flew with the RAF from 1949 until 1991! It played a number of roles throughout its service but mainly it was an anti-submarine aircraft and could carry up to 10,000lb of bombs, torpedoes or mines.












Handley Page Victor B.mk.2 (B.S)

Arguably the most capable of Britain's Cold War V-Bombers, the Handley Page Victor is certainly one of the most distinctive jet bombers to ever see service. With its high mounted T-tail and impressive crescent wing, the Victor saw service as a conventional bomber, nuclear bomber and finally as an airborne tanker aircraft, before its eventual retirement in 1993

Handley Page Victors of Britain's nuclear deterrent force were finished in an all over white anti-flash paint scheme, which was intended to afford some protection to the aircraft and crew in the event of a nuclear detonation – thankfully, the effectiveness of this system was never called upon. The final RAF Victors wore a hemp and light aircraft grey scheme, following their involvement in the Gulf War, in an in-flight re-fuelling capacity.



Eighth Air Force: Boeing B-17G™ & Bomber Re-Supply Set

The United States Army Air Force (USAAF) Eighth Air Force was created during World War II to support the Allied invasion of German occupied Europe by flying day-time strategic bombing missions from bases in Eastern England. By late 1944 the Eighth Air Force's air war over occupied Europe was at its height. Everyday hundreds of Boeing B-17 Flying Fortress and Consolidated B-24 Liberator bombers would head over German held territory, braving flak, German fighters and the weather to deliver bombs onto targets. Damage to returning aircraft was commonplace which often led to the cannibalisation of badly damaged airframes to keep others flying. The silver port wing on the B-17G depicted in this kit is an example of this practice and it is a testament to the skill and hard work of the ground crews that so many aircraft were kept serviceable in this way.








Hawker Typhoon Mk.1B

Introduced into service in 1941, the Hawker Typhoon was designed to be the RAF's new ultimate interceptor fighter. Superceding the Hawker Hurricane it was hoped that the Typhoon, together with the Spitfire, would be a powerful and effective opponent of the Luftwaffe. However, it was not to be. Initially plagued by mechanical woes from the engine and suffering from a deficit in performance at high altitude, the Typhoon instead found fame as a low level attack aircraft, a role to which it was both well-suited and hugely effective.

The powerful Hawker Typhoon fighterbomber earned a fearsome reputation as a devastating ground attack aircraft during the latter stages of WWII.

As German forces attempted to launch a massive counter offensive following the successful Allied landings on the beaches of Normandy in June 1944, they must have hoped that poor weather would restrict the flight operations of RAF Typhoon attack fighters. Armed with powerful Hispano 20mm cannon and either 500lb bombs, or eight unguided rockets, marauding Squadrons of Typhoons were capable of decimating German armoured units if they caught them in open ground. As Wehrmacht Panzer units rushed towards the Normandy beachheads in an attempt to provide much needed defensive re-enforcements, the Typhoons of the 2nd Tactical Air Force constantly harassed them, making it virtually impossible for them to move during daylight hours. Also free to attack targets of opportunity when weather conditions permitted, ground attack Typhoons took a heavy toll of German ground units, whilst providing invaluable 'on-call' close air support for advancing Allied troops in the weeks following the D-Day landings.


