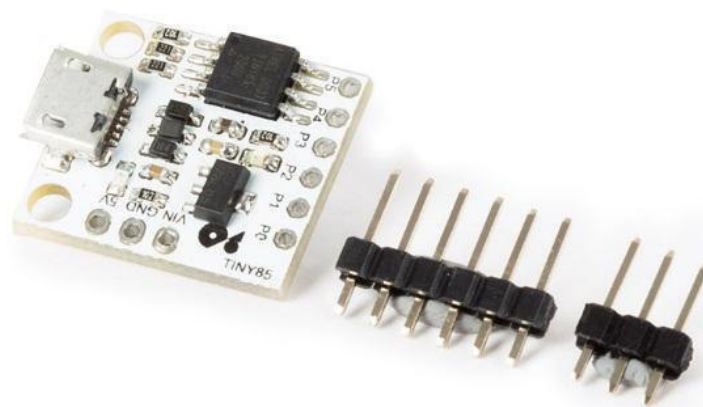

4. What is Arduino®

Arduino® is an open-source prototyping platform based in easy-to-use hardware and software. Arduino® boards are able to read inputs – light-on sensor, a finger on a button or a Twitter message – and turn it into an output – activating of a motor, turning on an LED, publishing something online. You can tell your board what to do by sending a set of instructions to the microcontroller on the board. To do so, you use the Arduino programming language (based on Wiring) and the Arduino® software IDE (based on Processing).

6. Using the VMA108

The VMA108 is pre-loaded with the “micronucleus tiny85” bootloader version 1.02, an open source project: <https://github.com/micronucleus/micronucleus> originally written by Bluebie: <https://github.com/Bluebie>. This makes it possible to program the ATTiny85/VMA108 with the Arduino® IDE.

The VMA108 has on-board USB, using the pins PB3 and PB4. When programming, the I/Os on the VMA108 should be left free.

When powering up the VMA108 (external or by the USB port) the USB function is activated during a few seconds. This means that, when you plug in the VMA108 on your Windows machine, Windows will try to install the correct USB driver. However, after 3-4 seconds the VMA108 will close the USB port and Windows will never install the correct driver.

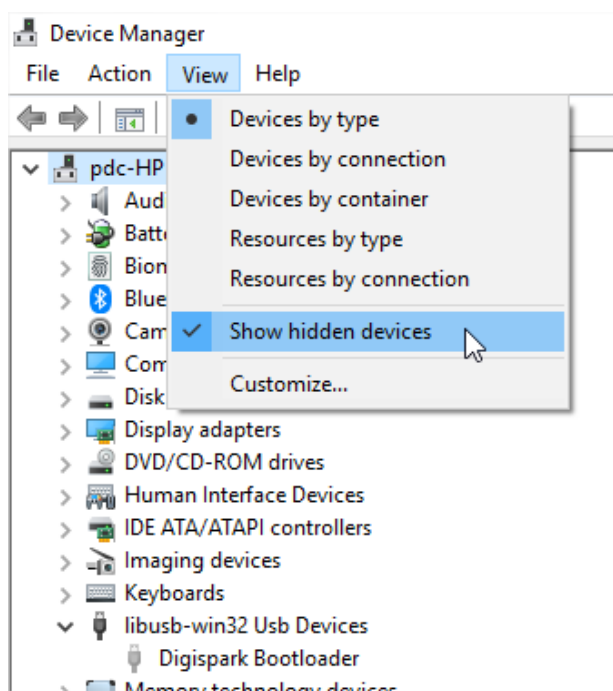
To avoid this, a special USB driver has to be installed.

1. Download the file digistump.drivers.zip from our website (<https://github.com/digistump/DigistumpArduino/releases>).
2. Unzip this file into a new directory.
3. Open this directory and locate DPinst.exe (32 bit) or DPinst64.exe (64 bit).

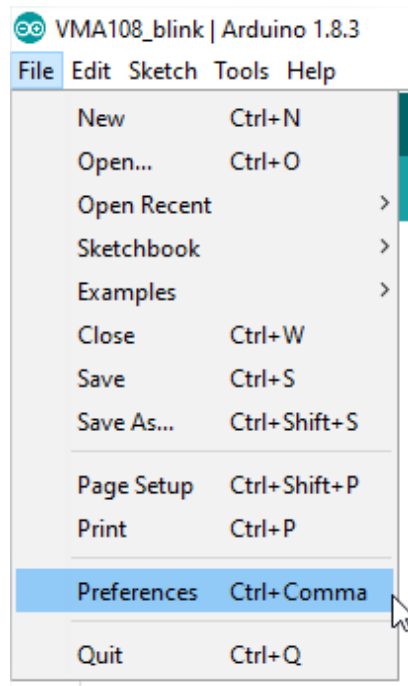

Double click one of these (depending of your machine) and install the driver.

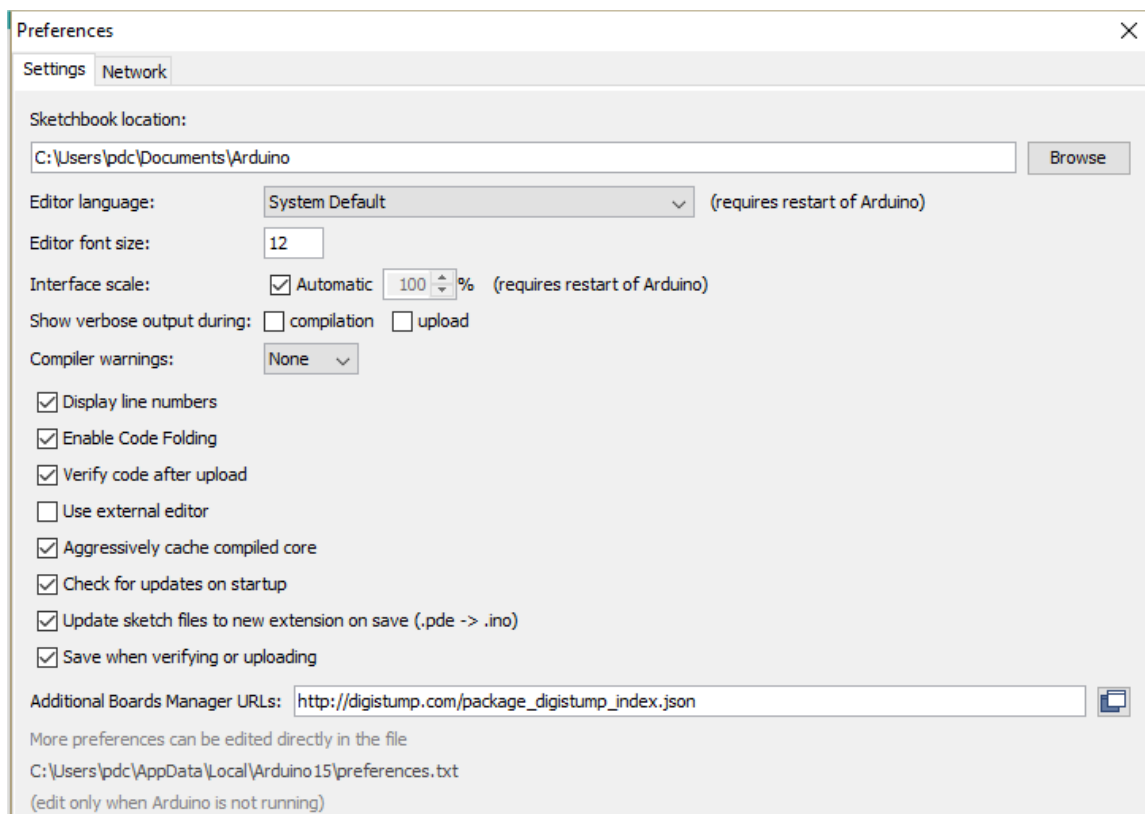
4. Now, open the Windows device manager and select View → Show Hidden Devices.
A device “libusb-win32 Usb Devices” should be in the list now.



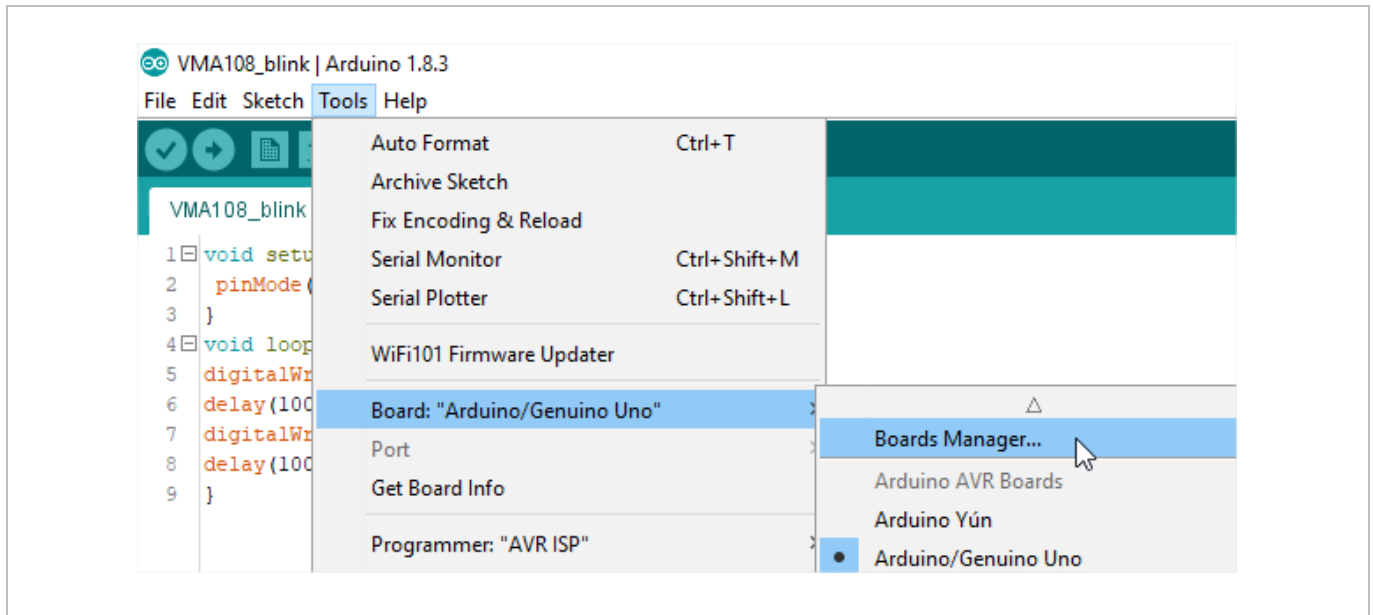
5. Close the device manager and open the Arduino® IDE (<https://www.arduino.cc/en/Main/Software>).
6. Open Files → Preferences.



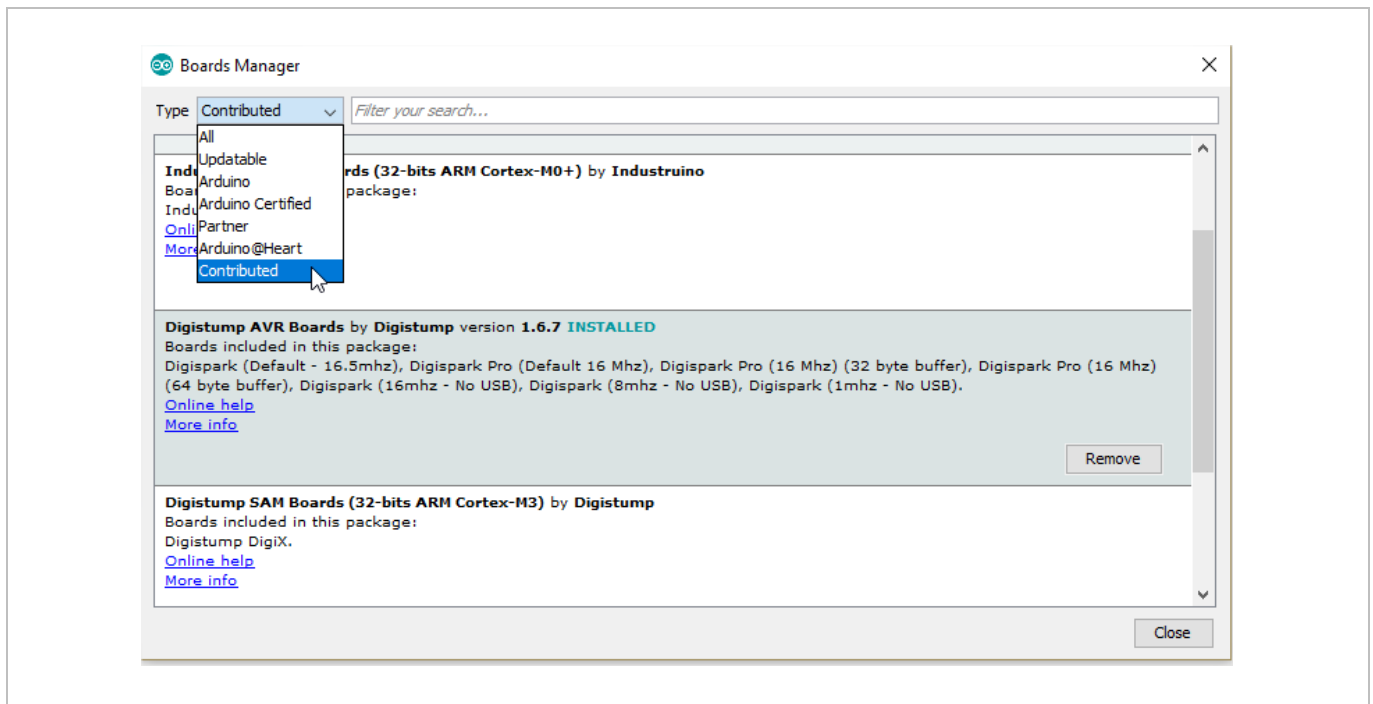
7. Enter http://digistump.com/package_digistump_index.json under "Additional Boards Manager URL's". Click OK.



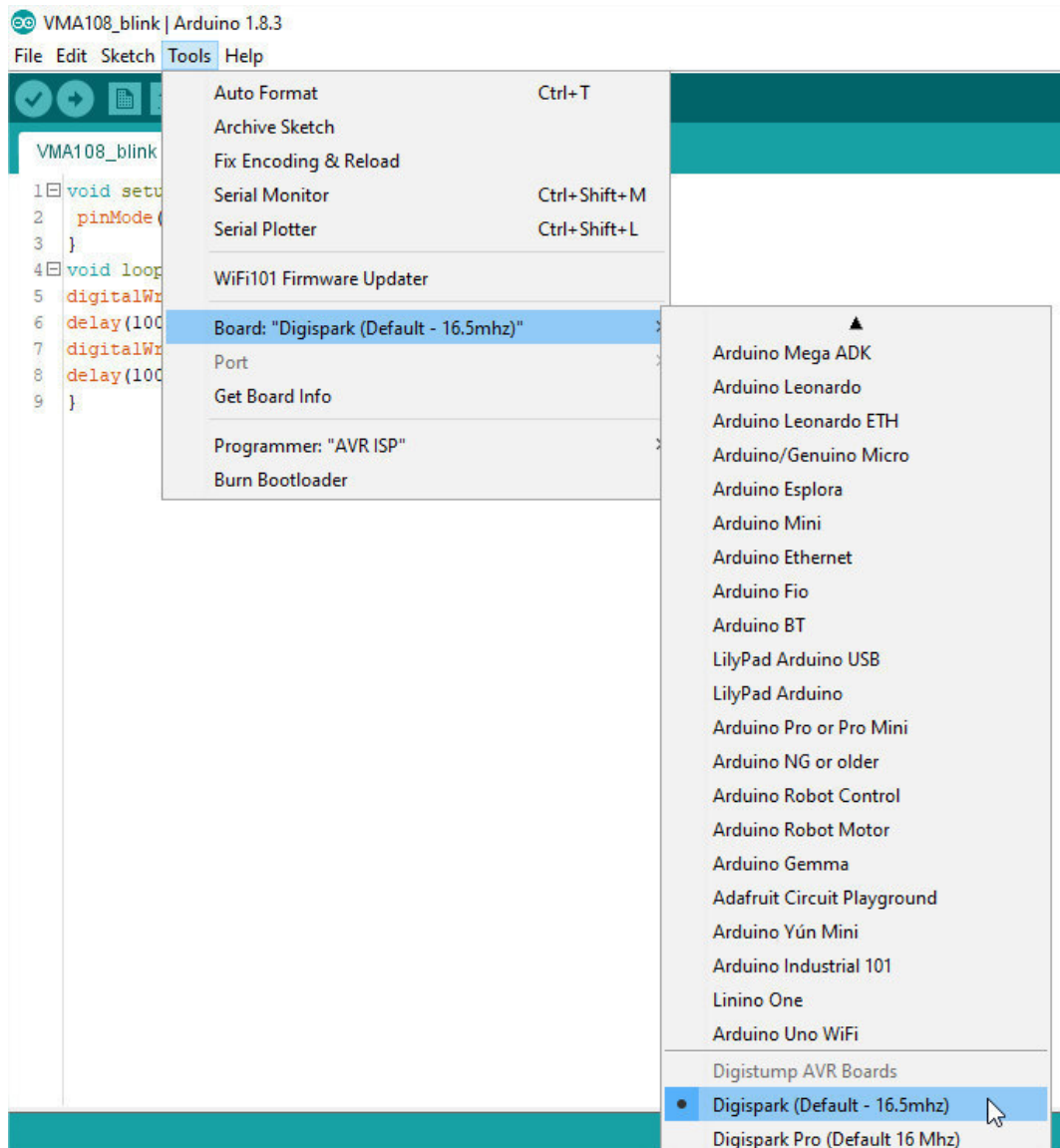
8. Go to Tools → Board → Boards Manager



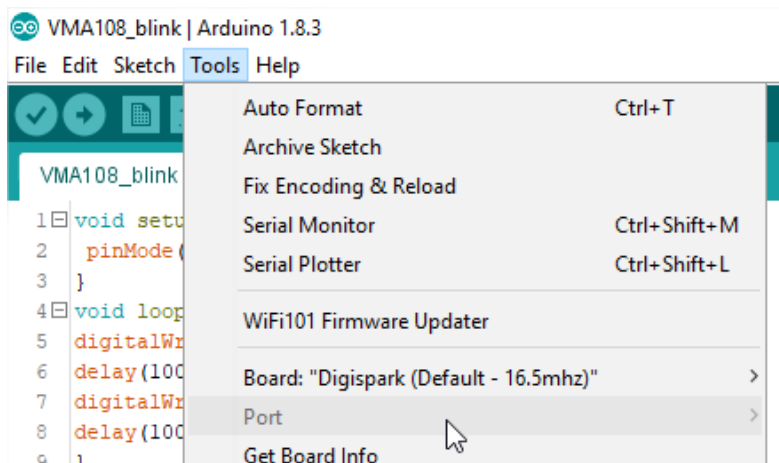
9. Select Contributed. Scroll through the list until you find Digistump AVR Boards by Digistump. Click Install. After installation, press Close.



10. Go back to the Tools → Boards. Select the Digispark (default 16.5 MHz) board.



After selecting this board, the field "Port" will remain grey. You cannot select a port due to the previously installed USB driver.



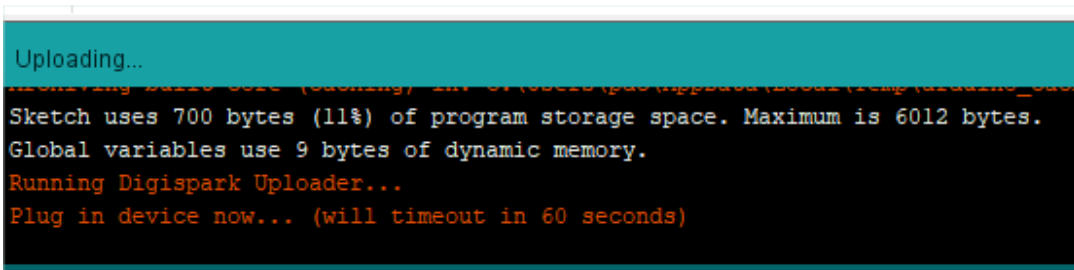
7. Example

Now we will try to send some code to the VMA108. Type the code below as an example. This code makes the on-board LED flash at a higher speed than before.

```
void setup() {
  pinMode(1, OUTPUT);
}
void loop() {
  digitalWrite(1,HIGH);
  delay(100);
  digitalWrite(1,LOW);
  delay(100);
}
```

Make sure the VMA108 is not connected to your computer at this moment!

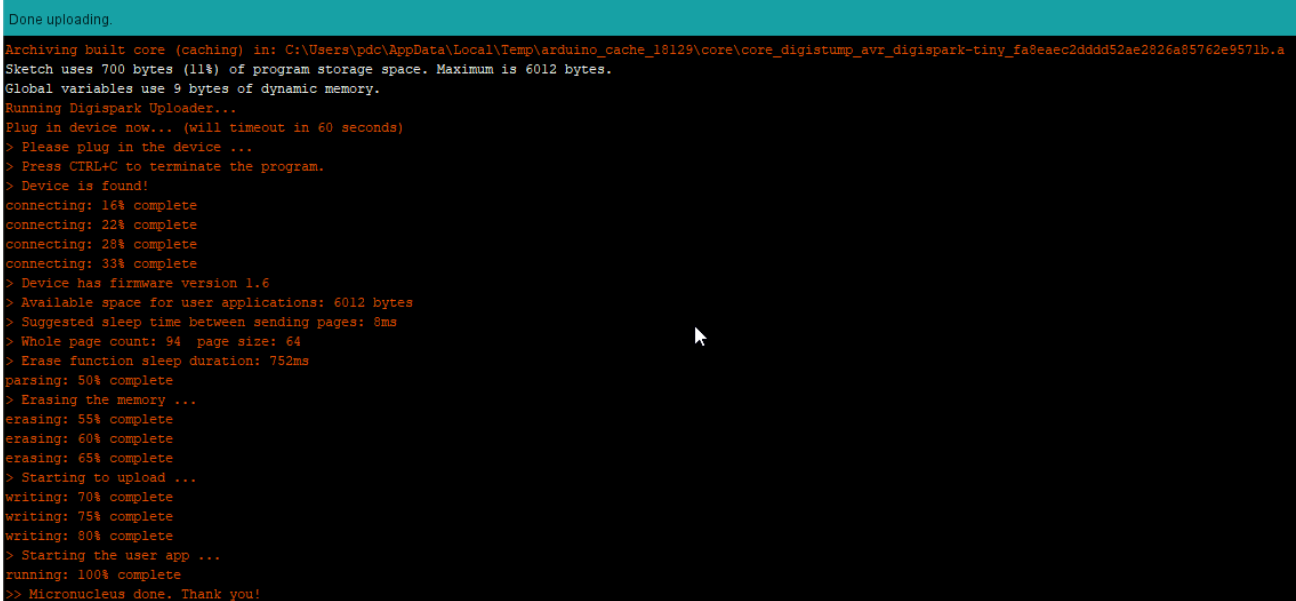
Press Upload in the IDE and keep watching when the actual upload starts. After compiling, you will see:

You will be delivered a replacing article or a refund at the value of 100% of the purchase price in case of a flaw occurred in the first year after the date of purchase and delivery, or a replacing article at 50% of the purchase price or a refund at the value of 50% of the retail value in case of a flaw occurred in the second year after the date of purchase and delivery.

• Not covered by warranty:

- all direct or indirect damage caused after delivery to the article (e.g. by oxidation, shocks, falls, dust, dirt, humidity...), and by the article, as well as its contents (e.g. data loss), compensation for loss of profits;
